Welcome Kindergarten Families! The following is an overview of our general curriculum.


LANGUAGE ARTS: TUSD has adopted the SRA Open Court Reading program. We use small and large group instruction to work on alphabet recognition, phonetic sounds, spelling patterns, and decodable short stories. Students are required to read or read to at home for a minimum of 20 minutes a day.

MATH: Our district adopted a new math series is MrGraw-Hill Math. It is a comprehensive program that introduces basic math skills, and it has a great deal of hands-on materials. Students will learn skip counting, place value, addition and subtraction facts to 20 , measurement, telling time, and many more.

SCIENCE: Our science curriculum has activities in life, physical, and earth science. Students will have the opportunity to observe, describe, predict, and classify using hands-on materials. Topics will include Living/Nonliving things, animals, and plant life.

SOCIAL STUDIES: Our lessons will focus on our country and its symbols, holidays, traditions, citizenship, and many more. Each unit lesson uses a student "newspaper" and students will have the opportunity to take these reading materials home to share what they have learned.

ASSESSMENTS: Students will be taught and assessed in the areas of Reading, Writing, Spelling, Speaking, Listening, Mathematics, and participation in Art, Science, Social Studies, and P.E. TUSD uses the rubric system on the students' report cards. These subject areas will be evaluated using the following rubric:

## CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT

My role is to create clear expectations for positive behavior and model those expectations to the students to learn in a safe, nurturing, and comfortable environment. Success depends on the choices we make. Students are rewarded for their efforts, and consequences occur when it's necessary. The Six Pillars of Character Education-Trustworthiness, Responsibility, Respect, Fairness, Caring, and Citizenship-are practiced in and outside of our classroom. A behavior colored-card system or "stop light method" (Clip up/Clip down) is used to assist students to self-monitor how they are doing in class.

## CLASS RULES:

- Listen carefully.
- Keep your hands and feet to yourself.
- Raise your hand and wait for your name to be called.
- Be a friend.
- Do your best!


## REWARDS:

- Positive praises: verbal praises. High fives, pat on the back, thumbs up, etc.
- Student of the month
- Happy notes/phone call home
- Clip up to LIGHT BLUE: sticker
- Clip up to DARK BLUE: prize from treasure box

- Clip up to PURPLE: TWO (2) prizes from the treasure box


## CONSEQUENCES:

1- Verbal Warning
